

Distribute vaccine equitably

Developed countries, global health authorities, and pharmaceutical companies in the forefront of the anticipated mass roll out of Covid 19 vaccines must ensure that distribution be equitable and immediately accessible to the rest of the nations if there is to be a global and lasting approach to solving the corona virus pandemic.

This was the call of Gwen Pimentel-Gana of the Commission Human Rights with the advent of the development of Covid 19 vaccines in western countries like the United States and the United Kingdom.

These vaccines are now have hurdled final-stage trials and eventual emergency use approval by the drug administration

in the United States.

At least three leading Covid 19 vaccines with promising efficacy developed by pharmaceutical giants Pfizer, Moderna and Astra Zeneca have been granted regulatory approvals that will pave the massive roll out in billions of doses to be administered to the global population.

Commissioner Gana emphasized that preservation of life is a fundamental human right.

She stressed that now that there is a major development in addressing the pandemic with the availability of vaccines, it is primordial that ethical solutions mirror and reflect the principles of human rights, universality and equity which are core values of the World Health Organization and the United Nations.


The Commission on Human Rights, Commissioner Gana shares the inspired vision of the World Health Organization (WHO) in which peoples of the world attain and promote the highest possible level of health and to “keep the world safe and serve the vulnerable”.

At the same time, Commissioner Gana emphasized that the enjoyment of the highest attainable standard of health is one of the fundamental rights of every human being without distinction of race, religion, political belief, economic or social condition.

“It is thus the responsibility of the developed nations to exert equal efforts and focus in distributing and sharing the Covid-19 vaccines to other countries, as they would to their own people,” she said.

After all, the achievement of any State in the promotion and protection of health is of value to all, she said.

Equally important, Commissioner Gana stressed, is that vaccines must be affordable to everyone in every country so that the targeted herd immunity would not be limited



to the population of a particular country but to the rest of the global population.

This is the clarion call that as a global community every nation in advancing this universal human right to health must act towards one another in the spirit of brotherhood.

Everyone, as a member of society, has the fundamental human right to social security, the protection of their health, and preservation of life through international co-operation and in accordance with the organization and resources of each State.

Commissioner Gana stressed that the health of all people around the world is fundamental to the attainment of peace and security and is dependent on the fullest co-operation of individuals and States.

Everyone has the right to a standard of living adequate for the health and well-being of each individual, including medical care and necessary health services, and the right to security in the event of sickness, Commissioner Gana said.


Under the present circumstances, the most effective method to continue our programs is through online seminar. A Zoom was used to invite participants to join the seminar.

programs and make them aware of the national issues like pandemic and issues on federalism, so that these young people will fully understand its importance and implications to society.

3. November 28, 2020, attended by more than 200 participants via zoom and FB page, composed of local government officials, academe, students and media people. It was a seminar online on the Bayanihan Federalism Draft Constitution.

The program format was that speakers and reactors discussed topics assigned to them, and followed by an open forum. The participants were given the opportunity to ask questions directly to the discussants.

As cited above, the participants of the forum were composed of media practitioners, LGU Officials, Heads of different organizations, members of the academe and students. They

were as catalysts for action, to bring the people together to discuss issues of common concern, ideas can be exchanged that lead to action and help educate and publicize the topic on Federalism.

Every forum was attended by more or less one hundred participants.

Renowned speakers and reactors knowledgeable and with deep understanding of the topics graced the affairs. They addressed the concerns and apprehensions raised by the participants, and the issues were fully discussed and responded.

During the forum, participants were very active in asking questions. Such as the timeline of proposal; sharing of powers between the national and the federated regions; fiscal







administration; the readiness of the Philippines to be federalized; political dynasty; and what the government is doing to increase the awareness of the people about federalism.

The participants confirmed that the information provided on the aspects of federalism and the Draft Federal Constitutions is relevant. They were able to identify the challenges and problems that need to be considered in the introduction of a federal system in the country.

After every forum, the HSF provided the participants with evaluation form, and the result was optimistic. The knowledge and understanding of participants on the adoption of a federal system of government in the Philippines, as well as about international experiences with federalism have a great impact to them.

Overall, the participants welcomed the opportunity to immerse more about federalism and the Bayanihan Federal Constitution. Most of the

respondents acknowledged having gained insights about federalism, and especially key features of the Draft Charter. However, some responses also exposed a need for more information on the topic and further clarification of certain aspects.

Since the lack of knowledge and understanding of the people is still a real challenge and the information needs to reach an even broader public, it was suggested by the attendees to conduct more forum, to help the public understand Federalism as a system of government and the proposed Draft Constitution for the Republic.

Whether federalism will eventually be adopted by the present or future administration, what is important is to continue the pursuit of informing, educating our people on the basic principles and foundations. An enlightened public will continue to highlight the issues on Federalism.


Also, part of the program were the video presentations of each batch showing their activities in the training camp before becoming a

Before the we end the year 2020, an online Publication Launch “Shades of Federalism” Philippines was held last December 22, 2020. This publication is a joint initiative of 50 Shades of Federalism and of the Hanns Seidel Foundation - Philippine Office and the Pimentel Institute for Leadership and Governance.

50 Shades of Federalism is a project established in October 2017 at Canterbury Christ Church University to help inform debate about many issues related to the topic of ‘federalism’.

It is our hope that this publication will contribute to the different debates on federalism, and will inspire people to continue to discuss and debate federalism and its advantages and disadvantages in the Philippines.

In the Philippines, two authors shared about their respective pieces in this publication and they are Atty. Michael Henry Ll. Yusingco Senior Research Fellow at the Ateneo Policy Center of the Ateneo School of Government, Ateneo de Manila University and Mr. Raymund John P. Rosuelo Chief of the Research and Knowledge Management Division of the Commission of Human Rights of Philippines. Dr. Alex B. Brillantes, Jr. from the

University of the Philippines and former Commissioner of the Commission on Higher Education, moderated the said launching.

Part also of the program is the discussion of Dr. Soeren Keil, Academic Director of 50 Shades of Federalism, Reader in Politics and International Relations at Canterbury Christ Church University. He talked about the background of 50 Shades of Federalism

Undersecretary Ryan L. Estevez, Executive Director, Unified Financial Assistance System for Tertiary Education Commission on Higher Education, also joined the launch and talked about the importance of the 50 shades of federalism publication especially to the academe.

This publication will help us to better understand what federalism is. The experiences of other countries before they became federal countries, can provide guidance for those planning to shift to a federal system of government such as the Philippines.
